# Management Discussion of Fund Performance

This management discussion of Fund performance presents views of the portfolio management team about the significant factors and developments during the past year that have affected the Fund's performance and outlook.

Please read the *Caution Regarding Forward-looking Statements* located on the first page of this document.

## Investment Objective and Strategies

The Fund aims to provide long-term capital growth primarily through exposure to the common shares of medium-capitalization U.S. corporations. The Fund aims to achieve this exposure by investing primarily in units of other Investors Group mutual fund(s) and/or directly in equity securities.

To achieve its investment objective, the Fund intends to invest up to 100% of its net assets in units of Investors U.S. Opportunities Fund (the Underlying Fund). The Underlying Fund aims to provide long-term capital growth by investing primarily in mid-sized U.S. corporations. To achieve the Underlying Fund's investment objective, the Underlying Fund seeks corporations that pass strict growth, profitability and valuation criteria.

## Change in Risk

Recently, mutual funds were required to determine their overall level of risk using a standardized classification methodology. As a result, the risk classification of the Fund has been revised from 'medium to high' to 'medium'. The change in risk ranking is not due to a change in the investment objective or strategies of the Fund.

## Results of Operations

### CHANGES IN NET ASSETS

The Fund's net assets decreased by 5.4% during the period to \$110.4 million. This change was comprised primarily of gains from operations of \$2.0 million and a decrease of \$8.2 million due to net securityholder activity.

### FEES AND EXPENSES

The management expense ratios (MERs) for Series B, JNL and U are lower than the MERs for the 12-month period ended March 31, 2017 primarily due to reductions in fee rates. MERs for all other series are generally similar to the MERs for the prior period. Total expenses paid also vary period to period as a result of changes in average assets in each series. Average net assets of the Fund for the period were \$113.2 million, an increase of 3.8% compared to the period ended March 31, 2017.

### INVESTMENT PERFORMANCE

In accordance with National Instrument 81-106, the following comparison to a broad-based index has been included to help you understand the Fund's performance relative to the general performance of the markets. However, the portfolio management team cautions that the Fund's mandate may be different from the index shown. For a description of the index, see *Annual Compound Returns*. Also, it is important to note that investors cannot invest in an index. Indirect investments in an index are available; however, there are fees and transaction costs and other variables that will impact returns when investing in these products. Index returns included in the comparison below do not reflect these costs and variables.

For the returns of all series and for longer-term performance of the Fund, see the *Past Performance* section of this report. Performance will vary by series primarily because fees and expenses may differ between series, or because securities of a series were not issued and outstanding for the entire reporting period. See *Series Information* for the annual expense rates for each series.

For the year ended March 31, 2018, the Series B securities returned 1.1% (after deducting fees and expenses paid by the Fund). In comparison, the S&P 500 Index Total Return \$ CAD returned 10.4%.

A strong second half lifted U.S. equities to a solid gain over the period, driven by tax reform and accelerating corporate earnings growth. Fear of inflation and more aggressive U.S. Federal Reserve monetary policy triggered the return of volatility and a global stock market correction in early February. The initial downturn was brief as a market rebound and a weaker Canadian dollar saw the index touch new highs in Canadian dollars just five weeks later. However, rising global trade tensions caused stocks to again retreat as the period ended. The information technology sector, especially mega-capitalization companies, was the clear leader throughout the period. The financials sector came in a strong second, benefitting from rising interest rates. The so-called "bond-proxies" (the telecommunication services, real estate, consumer staples and utilities sectors), which tend to underperform as rates rise, lost ground over the period, as did the energy sector.

As at March 31, 2018, substantially all the net assets of the Fund were invested in Investors U.S. Opportunities Fund (the Underlying Fund).

The Underlying Fund's investment decisions in the information technology sector detracted from performance relative to the index. Stock selection in the consumer discretionary, industrials and health care sectors also detracted from relative performance, along with an overweight position compared to the index in the underperforming real estate sector. Stock selection in the materials sector and an underweight position in the underperforming consumer staples sector contributed positively to relative performance.

## Recent Developments

(BASED ON INFORMATION AS AT APRIL 20, 2018)

The portfolio management team expects robust economic growth to continue in the U.S. However, it is likely to bring higher interest rates and labour cost pressures, which should be partly offset by the benefits of recent government tax reforms. A weakening U.S. dollar should benefit export-oriented companies, while pushing inflation for imported goods higher. Demand for goods and services has improved in most sectors of the economy, including the energy sector, which continues to recover at a gradual pace.

The Underlying Fund's exposure to the real estate sector was reduced, with proceeds redeployed into the industrials, consumer discretionary and information technology sectors. These sectors are expected to benefit most from tax reforms and from the expected positive impact of those reforms on consumer spending.

The Underlying Fund shifted holdings toward smaller-capitalization companies over the period, funded by gradual reduction of exposure to larger-capitalization stocks. This approach is expected to benefit the Fund as it broadens the Underlying Fund's investment universe, provides greater industry exposure and ensures a wider range of valuations, without compromising the Fund's focus on companies with robust balance sheets and strong cash flow or growing cash-flow prospects.

The Fund's exposure to the small-cap and mid-capitalization segments of the equity market could increase performance vulnerability in the event of an overall market downturn. A strong rebound in the growth segment of the market could also negatively affect the Fund's relative performance.

## Related Party Transactions

I.G. Investment Management, Ltd. is the Manager and Portfolio Advisor of the Fund. The Fund is offered through the Consultants of Investors Group Financial Services Inc. and Investors Group Securities Inc., together referred to as the Distributors. The Manager, Portfolio Advisor and Distributors are, indirectly, wholly owned subsidiaries of IGM Financial Inc.

Effective November 1, 2017, the following sub-advisor has been retained to provide investment services to the Underlying Fund:

- Mackenzie Financial Corporation

Mackenzie Financial Corporation is, indirectly, a wholly owned subsidiary of IGM Financial Inc.

The Fund paid a management fee to the Manager and Portfolio Advisor for management and portfolio advisory services (see *Management Fees*).

The Fund also paid the Manager an administration fee and in exchange the Manager paid the operating costs and expenses of the Fund, except for certain specified costs.

The Fund paid the Distributors a service fee as compensation for providing or arranging for the provision of services to the Fund, including the issue or allotment of securities.

See *Series Information* for the annual rates paid by each series (as a percent of average net assets) for these fees.

Securityholders in Series U also pay an advisory fee directly to Investors Group. This fee is not included in the Fund's expenses.

The Fund invests substantially all of its assets in another Investors Group fund.

## Management Fees

The Fund pays Investors Group a management fee. The management fee paid by each series is calculated as a percentage of the net asset value of the series, as of the close of business on each business day (see *Series Information* for rates payable by each series). Generally, management fees are used to pay costs incurred in providing investment advisory and management services and in part for distribution-related services provided by the Distributors.

Securityholders in Series U pay an advisory fee directly to the Distributors for distribution-related services and therefore the management fee in that series is for investment advisory and management services only.

For all other retail series (i.e. which excludes Series F, P and S, if issued), approximately 53% of management fees paid during the period represents investment advisory and management services, and approximately 47% represents distribution-related services. This may vary by series.

Approximately 65% of the total fees paid by the Fund for the period relates to services provided by the Manager and Portfolio Advisor, and approximately 35% relates to services provided by the Distributors.

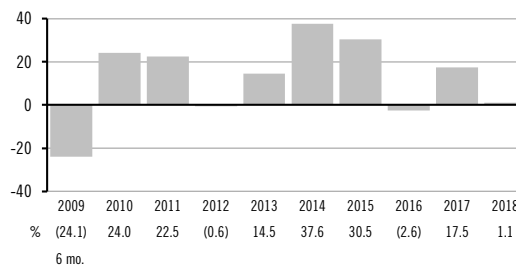
Performance during these periods may have been impacted by the following events:

- Effective July 1, 2010, the administration fees for Series A and B decreased by 0.02% to 0.23%.
- Effective June 30, 2012, the annual management fee rate for Series A and B decreased by 0.15% to 1.85%.
- Effective June 30, 2012, the annual service fee rate for Series B decreased by 0.05% to 0.40%.
- The Fund changed its investment objective and strategies to invest primarily in securities of Investors U.S. Opportunities Fund and/or directly in equity securities, on June 12, 2013.
- Effective January 1, 2017, the annual management fee rate for Series U decreased by 0.10% to 0.75%.
- Effective January 1, 2017, the annual service fee rate for Series B and JNL decreased by 0.10% to 0.30%.

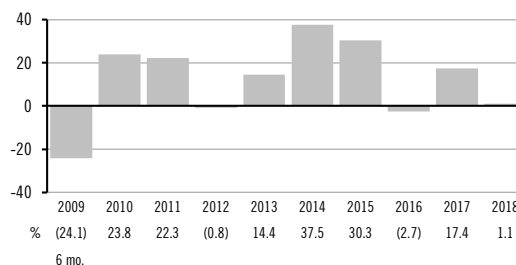
### Year-by-Year Returns

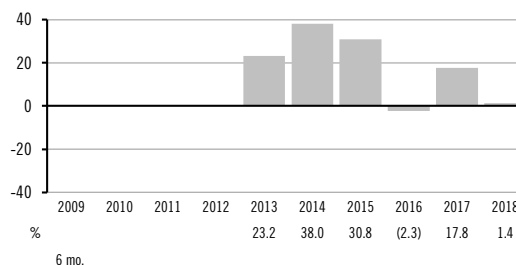

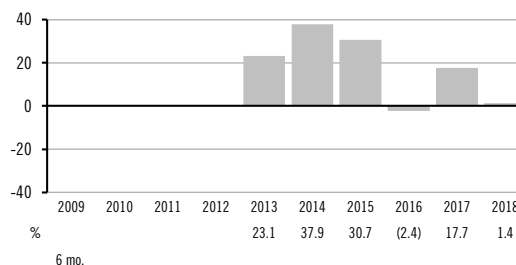

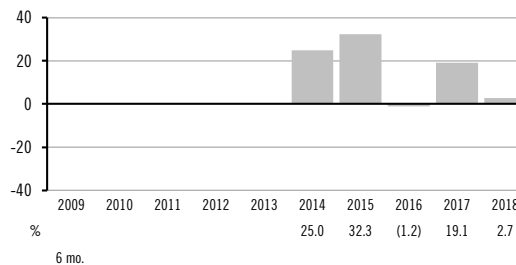

There is not necessarily a relationship between a high turnover rate and the performance of a Fund.
