Management Discussion of Fund Performance

This management discussion of Fund performance presents views of the portfolio management team about the significant factors and developments during the past six months that have affected the Fund's performance and outlook since March 31, 2018, the Fund's most recent fiscal year-end. This report should be read in conjunction with the annual Management Report of Fund Performance for the year ended March 31, 2018.

Results of Operations

CHANGES IN NET ASSETS

The Fund's net assets increased by 3.5% during the period to \$114.3 million. This change was comprised primarily of gains from operations of \$8.6 million and a decrease of \$4.7 million due to net securityholder activity.

FEES AND EXPENSES

The management expense ratios (MERs) for all series are generally similar to the MERs for the 12-month period ended March 31, 2018. Total expenses paid vary period to period mainly as a result of changes in average assets in each series. Average net assets of the Fund for the period were \$113.7 million, an increase of 0.8% compared to the period ended September 30, 2017.

INVESTMENT PERFORMANCE

In accordance with National Instrument 81-106, the following comparison to a broad-based index has been included to help you understand the Fund's performance relative to the general performance of the markets. However, the portfolio management team cautions that the Fund's mandate may be different from the index shown. Also, it is important to note that investors cannot invest in an index. Indirect investments in an index are available; however, there are fees and transaction costs and other variables that will impact returns when investing in these products. Index returns included in the comparison below do not reflect these costs and variables.

For the returns of all series and for longer-term performance of the Fund, see the *Past Performance* section of this report. Performance will vary by series primarily because fees and expenses may differ between series, or because securities of a series were not issued and outstanding for the entire reporting period. See *Series Information* for the annual expense rates for each series.

For the six-month period ended September 30, 2018, the Series B securities returned 7.4% (after deducting fees and expenses paid by the Fund). In comparison, the S&P 500 Index Total Return \$ CAD returned 11.8%.

The acceleration of the U.S. economy and share prices continued during the period. This lifted the S&P 500 Index Total Return \$ CAD to a record high and extended the current equity bull market to the longest in history. All market sectors advanced as economic growth gathered momentum and inflation remained tame. The continuing tailwind from corporate tax reform helped sustain annual earnings growth for S&P 500 companies at close to 25% throughout the period. Some of the best-performing groups – including the information technology, health care and consumer discretionary sectors – were driven by a positive outlook for growth as consumer and business confidence reached multi-decade highs. The financials and materials sectors, along with the defensive utilities and consumer staples sectors, lagged the broader index.

During the period, substantially all the net assets of the Fund were invested in Investors U.S. Opportunities Fund (the Underlying Fund).

The Underlying Fund's stock selection in the energy and industrials sectors, and investment decisions in the information technology sector, detracted from performance relative to the index. Stock selection in the consumer discretionary sector and investment decisions in the consumer staples sector contributed positively to relative performance.

Recent Developments

(BASED ON INFORMATION AS AT OCTOBER 21, 2018)

The portfolio management team expects robust economic growth to continue in the U.S. However, inflation pressures are starting to have a negative impact on corporate profits, partially offsetting the benefits of tax reform. Escalating global trade tensions and mid-term elections in the U.S. have triggered more equity market volatility. Amid a continued positive economic outlook but higher inflation, the Underlying Fund increased exposure to sectors of the equity market that are less sensitive to pricing, such as information technology and health care. The Underlying Fund's exposure to the industrials sector was reduced and investments in the materials sector were sold to realize profits in the wake of recent strong performance.

Other Developments

CHANGES IN THE INVESTORS GROUP FUNDS INDEPENDENT REVIEW COMMITTEE

Recently, Peggy Dowdall-Logie and Louis-Daniel Gauvin replaced Jean Lamarre and Robert Tessier as members of the Investors Group Funds Independent Review Committee and Russell Goodman was appointed Chair.

Related Party Transactions

I.G. Investment Management, Ltd. is the Manager and Portfolio Advisor of the Fund. The Fund is offered through the Consultants of Investors Group Financial Services Inc. and Investors Group Securities Inc., together referred to as the Distributors. The Manager, Portfolio Advisor and Distributors are, indirectly, wholly owned subsidiaries of IGM Financial Inc.

The following sub-advisor provided investment services to the Underlying Fund:

- Mackenzie Financial Corporation

Mackenzie Financial Corporation is a wholly owned subsidiary of IGM Financial Inc.

The Fund paid a management fee to the Manager and Portfolio Advisor for management and portfolio advisory services (see *Management Fees*).

The Fund also paid the Manager an administration fee and in exchange the Manager paid the operating costs and expenses of the Fund, except for certain specified costs.

The Fund paid the Distributors a service fee as compensation for providing or arranging for the provision of services to the Fund, including the issue or allotment of securities.

See *Series Information* for the annual rates paid by each series (as a percent of average net assets) for these fees.

Securityholders in Series U also pay an advisory fee directly to Investors Group. This fee is not included in the Fund's expenses.

The Fund invests substantially all of its assets in another Investors Group fund.

Management Fees

The Fund pays a management fee, and this fee, paid by each series, is calculated as a percentage of the net asset value of the series at the close of each business day (see *Series Information* for rates payable by each series). Generally, management fees pay the costs incurred to provide investment advisory and management services, as well as distribution-related services provided by the Distributors.

However, in the case of Series U, securityholders pay the Distributor an advisory fee (separate from the management fee) directly. Therefore, the management fee in that series is used for investment advisory and management services only.

For all other retail series (i.e. which excludes Series F, P and S, if issued), approximately 65% of management fees paid during the period was used for investment advisory and management services, and approximately 35% related to distribution-related services. This may vary by series.

Approximately 74% of the total fees paid by the Fund for the period related to services provided by the Manager and Portfolio Advisor, and approximately 26% related to services provided by the Distributors.

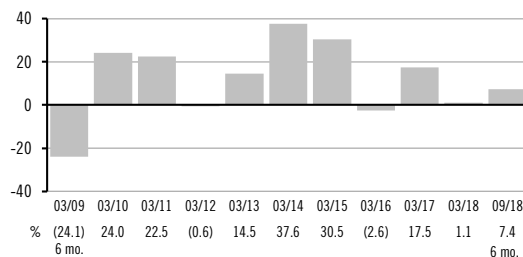
Performance during these periods may have been impacted by the following events:

- Effective July 1, 2010, the administration fees for Series A and B decreased by 0.02% to 0.23%.
- Effective June 30, 2012, the annual management fee rate for Series A and B decreased by 0.15% to 1.85%.
- Effective June 30, 2012, the annual service fee rate for Series B decreased by 0.05% to 0.40%.
- The Fund changed its investment objective and strategies to invest primarily in securities of Investors U.S. Opportunities Fund and/or directly in equity securities, on June 12, 2013.
- Effective January 1, 2017, the annual management fee rate for Series U decreased by 0.10% to 0.75%.
- Effective January 1, 2017, the annual service fee rate for Series B and JNL decreased by 0.10% to 0.30%.

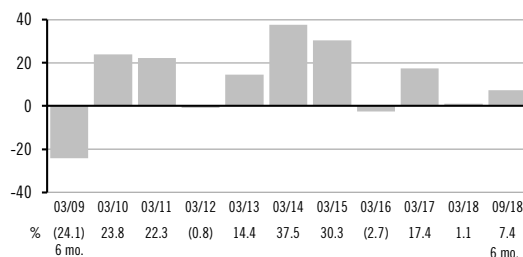
Year-by-Year Returns

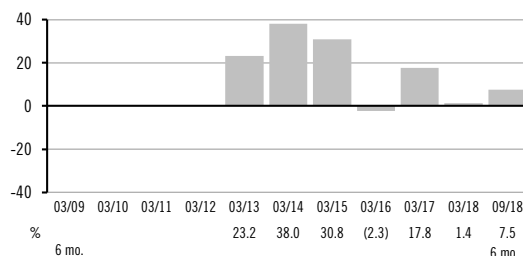

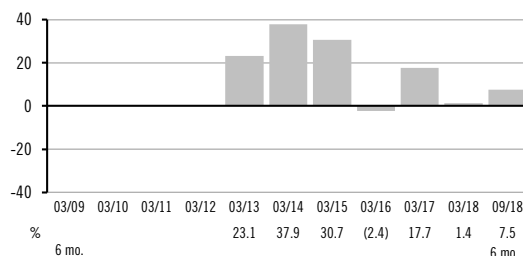

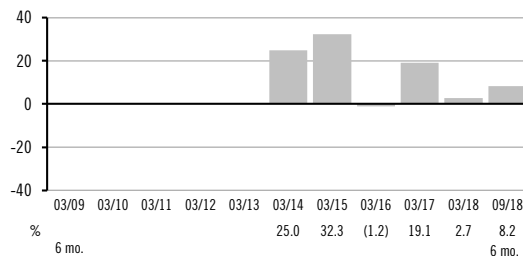

Where a Fund directly or indirectly via derivative contract invests in securities of an Underlying Fund, the MERs presented for the Fund include the portion of MERs of the Underlying Fund attributable to this investment. Any income distributions received from exchange-traded funds (ETFs) managed by affiliates of the Manager, with the intention of offsetting fees paid within those ETFs but which are not considered to be duplicative fees under regulatory requirements, are treated as waived expenses for MER purposes. Certain expenses that are non-recurring and/or otherwise uncertain as to their future timing and amount have not been annualized.

⁶ The trading expense ratio (TER) represents total commissions and other portfolio transaction costs incurred as an annualized percentage of daily average net assets during the period. Where a Fund invests in securities of an Underlying Fund, the TERs presented for the Fund include the portion of TERs of the Underlying Fund(s) attributable to this investment.

⁷ The Fund's portfolio turnover rate indicates how actively the Fund's Portfolio Advisor manages its portfolio investments. A portfolio turnover rate of 100% is equivalent to the Fund buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the period. Generally, the higher a Fund's portfolio turnover rate in a period, the greater the trading costs payable by it in the period, and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the period. The portfolio turnover rate for the Fund for March 2014 reflects the investment objective change and thereafter the rebalancing necessary to maintain its investment in the Underlying Fund. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high turnover rate and the performance of a Fund. Transactions incurred to realign the Fund's portfolio after a fund merger, if any, are excluded from the portfolio turnover rate.
